ICHNEUMONIDAE OF THE HURON MOUNTAINS AREA

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On two occasions I was the guest of the Huron Mountain Wildlife Foundation, while collecting ichneumon flies (parasitic Hymenoptera) in the Huron Mountains area of Michigan. I was in the area from July 19 to 31, 1959 and from June 26 to 30, 1960. About four thousand specimens were collected. Due to the primitive status of knowledge about these insects, identification of the specimens has proceeded very slowly, but it seems time now to give a report on the studies completed to date.

Below are lists of the collections of certain subfamilies. These comprise about 30% of the family (the best known part). Specimens of the tribes Hemigasterini and Mesostenini have been used in two monographic studies recently published, and in these groups 15 new species were described from Huron Mountains material. The new species are marked in the lists with an asterisk. In the case of 5 of these the holotype is from the Huron Mountains. Another monograph, on the subfamily Banchinae, is in preparation and here again the Huron Mountains collections will be used in the descriptions of new species.

During my stay collections were made at random over most of the Huron Mountains area, but concentrating in the meadows and woods along the Salmon Trout River and around the edges of Cranberry Marsh. Several days were spent on the Yellow Dog Plains and one day at Ives Lakes. Noteworthy features about the collections were a number of range extensions of around a thousand miles, recapture of some species found only once previously, and the finding of considerable tendency in this area for eastern subspecies to be intermediate to, or mingled with, western subspecies.

Mature dead tree trunks is a type of habitat common in the Huron Mountains but seldom found elsewhere. The ichneumonids associated with this now scarce type of habitat, usually as parasites of borers in dead wood, were present in great variety and abundance.

The opportunity to study ichneumonids in this interesting area, and under pleasant circumstances, is very much appreciated.
